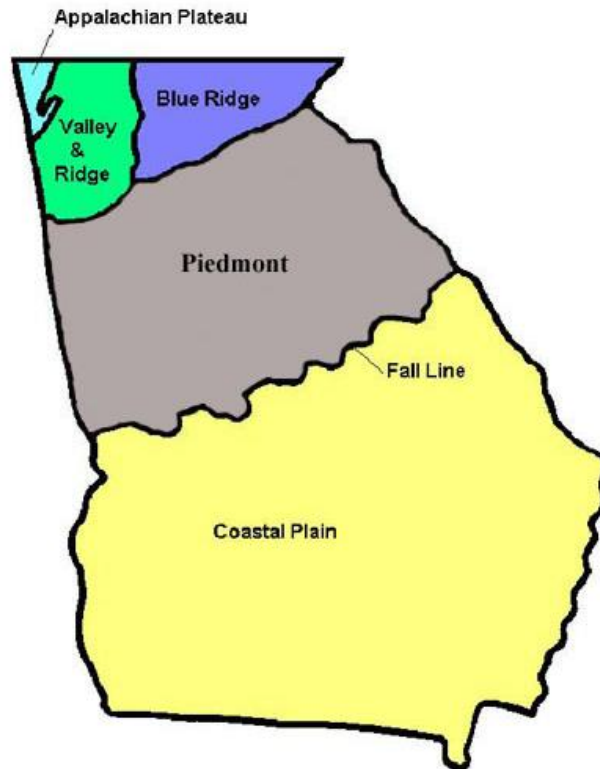


Regions of Georgia

Region Characteristics: Please know the following defining characteristics of each region.

<p style="text-align: center;">The Appalachian Plateau</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is the smallest region of Georgia. • A plateau is an area of high, flat land. • The area also has mountains; two of these mountains are Sand Mountain and Lookout Mountain. 	<p style="text-align: center;">The Ridge and Valley</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This region has long, narrow strips of land. • The soil in the valley is good for farming. • People grow fruits such as apples in this region.
<p style="text-align: center;">The Blue Ridge Mountains</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This region has the state's tallest mountains. • Some of the state's biggest rivers begin in the mountains of this region. 	<p style="text-align: center;">The Piedmont Region</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is the region where most of Georgia's people live. • The land is hilly and has many forests. • Many of the state's largest cities are in this region.
<p style="text-align: center;">The Coastal Plain</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is the state's largest region. • It has flat or nearly flat land. • The soil is very sandy. • Pine and oak trees grow in the sandy soil.
